Answer Key

- 1. Why does Penny's mother think losing the tablet might be a good thing? She believes it will help Penny realize she's been spending too much time on it and neglecting other important things.
- 2. How does Penny's field trip change her perspective?
  Penny enjoys the beauty of nature and connecting with friends, which feels less stressful than keeping up with her tablet.
- 3. What lesson does Penny's story teach children and adults? It teaches the importance of screen safety, moderation, and appreciating the world around us.
- 4. How does Penny's relationship with her tablet evolve throughout the story?

Penny initially loves her tablet but later learns to use it less and prioritize real-world experiences.

## Vocabulary Memory Directions


Students will play this game like the traditional Memory game.

At the end of the game, the student with the most cards wins.

















## Empathy Exercise

How can we show empathy to friends who feel stressed or upset?






### Moderation


